

- -Money to help pay for education
- -It's free and safe to apply for federal and state financial aid
- -Most students can get help paying for college, regardless of their citizenship status.

#### WHAT FINANCIAL AID CAN BE USED TO PAY

- + Community College
  - + Associate Degree
  - + Vocational training/certificate
- + 4 year colleges/universities
- + Vocational School (remember vocational certificates also offered at community college)



#### Types of Financial Aid

<u>Merit-based Aid</u>: offers financial support (\$) based on a student's academic and/or extracurricular achievements

<u>Need-based Aid</u>: provides funds (\$) for students based on their level of financial need

Students may receive both types of aid to fund their post-secondary studies.



- + Grants
- + Federal Work Study
- + Middle Class Scholarship
- + Scholarships



#### CALIFORNIA CAL GRANT

- Partially covers cost of tuition at a CSU or UC for four years
- + Gives a designated amount of money to students attending a private college in California
- + Offered to some California residents attending a community college or university in California
- + Must have demonstrated financial need
- + Attend a qualifying California college or university

#### CALIFORNIA RESIDENCY



For Cal Grant purposes a resident is a student who graduates from a California High School and is:

- + A US citizen who has been in California for one year or
- + A non US Citizen who has been in California for three years


#### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

- + Local, State and National
- + Individual colleges have their own scholarships (Check college's website Financial Aid page as soon as possible)
- + Check on Naviance on the Scholarship Search Page -

Scholarships will each have their own application



#### FINANCIAL AID YOU HAVE TO PAY BACK

Loans are a type of financial aid you have to pay back plus interest.

- + Federal/State loans: may be offered once a student completes a FAFSA/CADAA application. Usually offer lower interest rates.
- + Private: available through local banks, usually have higher interest rates.



#### How Much WILL COLLEGE COST?



#### **DIRECT COSTS**

- + Tuition and Fees
- On-Campus Room and Board (Meal Plan)
- + These costs will show up on the college bill

#### **INDIRECT COSTS**

- + Books and Supplies
- + Off-Campus Room & Board (Meals)
- + Personal Expenses
- + Travel Costs
- + These costs <u>do not</u> show up on the college bill.

#### How to CALCULATE NET COST

Total cost (Gross) – Grants/Awards =  $\underline{\text{Net Cost}}$ 

Net cost is paid for by taking out loans or paying out of pocket.




All students must complete a FAFSA or CADAA application in their senior year.







