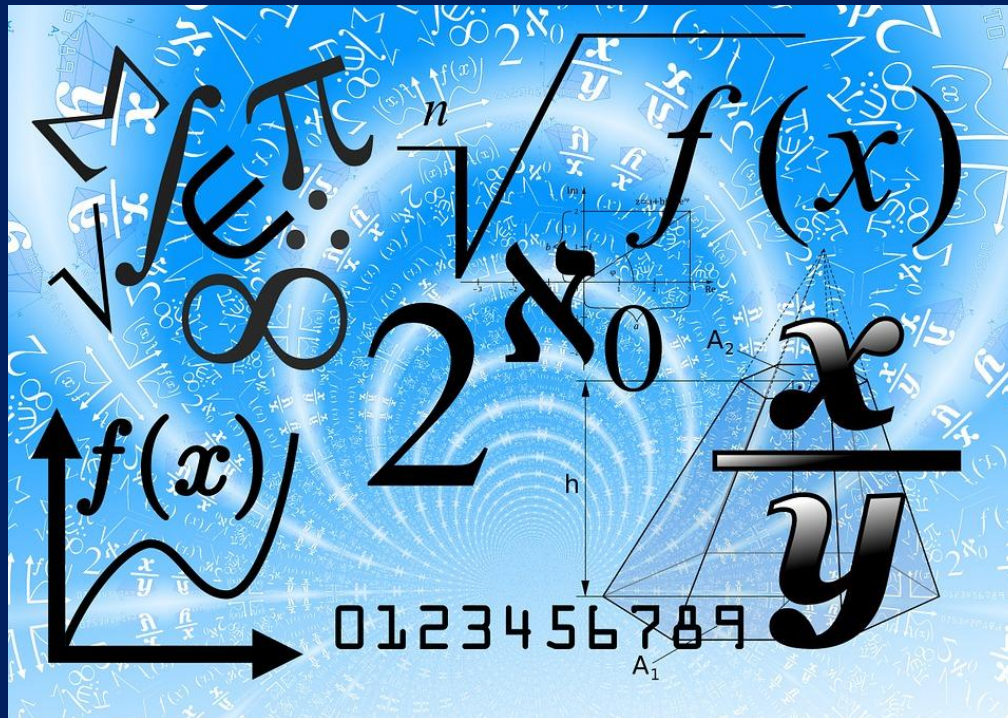

Graduation vs. Four Year College Requirements

Graduation Requirements

- Students must take and pass courses in specific subject areas in order to earn a high school diploma.



- Students must earn a total of 220 credits in these specific subjects.

College Requirements (“a – g”)

- Courses required by UC and CSU to be eligible to apply for admission following high school graduation.
- Students must earn a “C” or better in “a-g” courses.

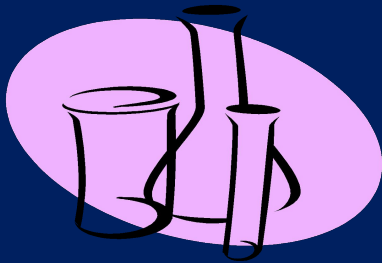

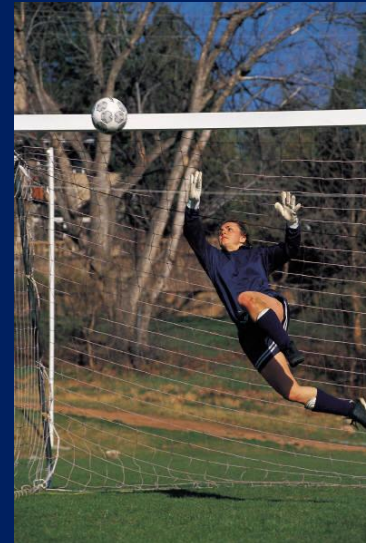
Physical Education

 - Freshmen must take PE 1
 - Students must pass PFT or take PE 2 as a sophomore.(???)
 - Dance and Weight Training are available for those students who pass the PFT

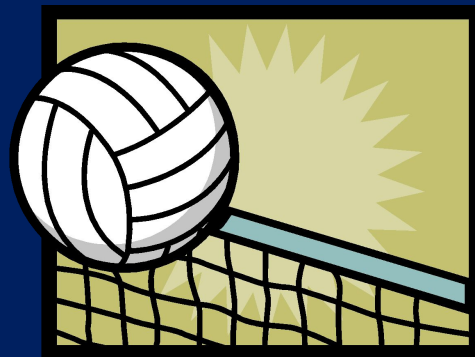

- Each sport is 3.5 credits
- Sports count as elective credits
- 3.5 credits of PE can be waived for each sport in 10th, 11th and 12th grade
- Students must maintain a 2.0 gpa to play sports

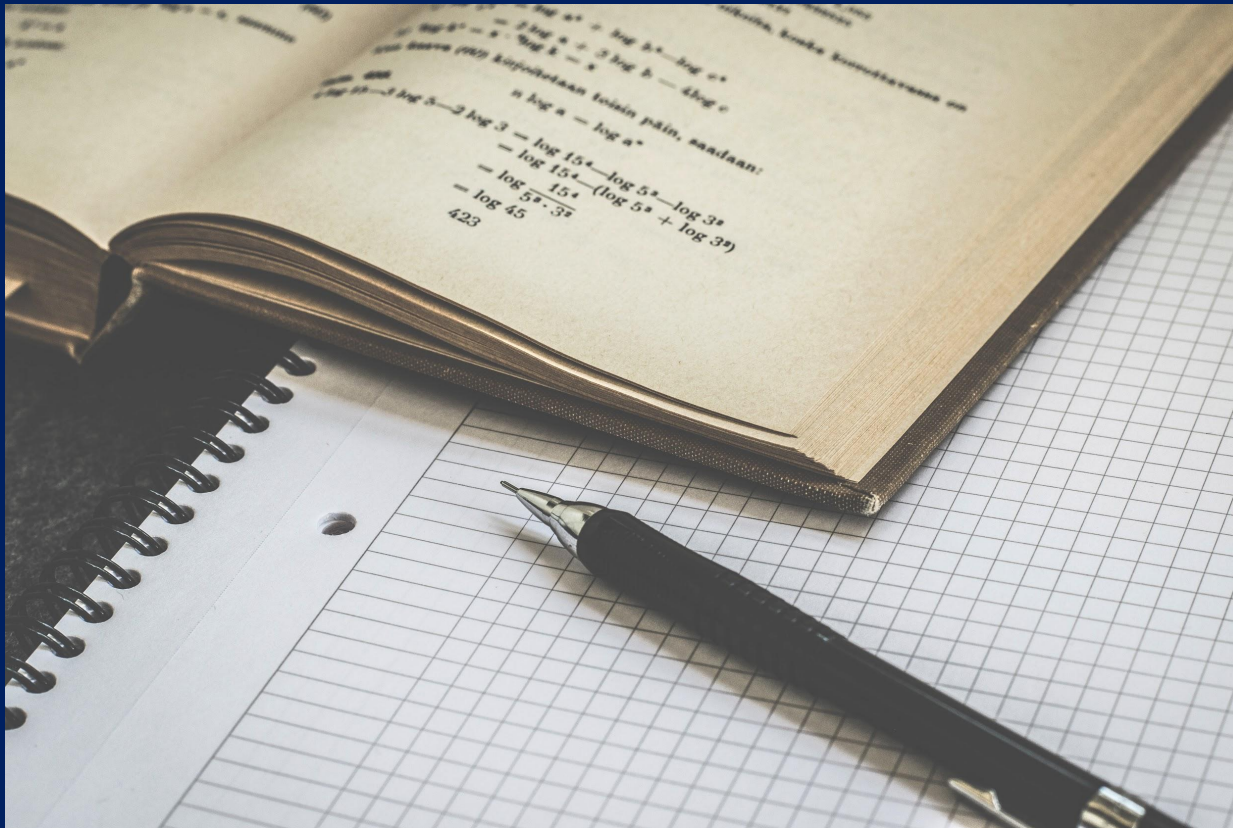
