# College Fit

(Best indication students will graduate from the college they attend.)

# Social

- Location: access a major city, close to home, etc.
- Campus Size
- Campus Life: quiet, lively, commuter, residential, etc.
- Sports (NCAA or Intramural)
- Dorms/Greek Life/Clubs
- Diversity (race, religion, politics, etc.)
- Affordability

# Academic

- Available majors
- Qtr vs. Semester system
- Research vs Hands-on
- Lecture Hall vs Seminar (GE)
- Access to professors/classes
- Research & Internships (guaranteed vs. competitive)
- Graduate school vs career readiness

# What are your chances of admission?

Solid - your academic profile exceeds those of the average accepted student.

Probable - your transcript mirrors the profile of previous admitted students.

Possible - your chances of rejection are higher than chances of admission.

Reach - your academic profile is much lower than average admitted students.

# University of CA (UC) Cal State University (CSU) Out-of-State Public Universities

# University of CA (UC)

- Research & analytical thinking skills (liberal arts)
- Quarter system (except for Cal & Merced)
- Most campuses & majors are very selective.
- Admission uses Comprehensive or Holistic Review.
  - > 13 Admission factors (next slide).
  - > Special majors may require audition/portfolio
  - > SAT/ACT scores will NOT be considered

UC spends time evaluating your academic achievements in light of the opportunities available to you and your demonstrated capacity to contribute to the intellectual life at UC. Some factors they may consider are:

- Academic grade point average in all completed A-G courses, including additional points for completed UC-certified honors courses.
- 2. Number of, content of and performance in academic courses beyond the minimum A-G.
- 3. Number of and performance in UC-approved honors, AP, and transferable college courses.
- 4. Identification by UC as being ranked in the top 9 percent of your high school class at the end of your junior year ( ELC).
- 5. Quality of your senior-year program (rigor).
- Quality of your academic performance relative to the educational opportunities available in your high school.
- 7. Outstanding performance in one or more specific subject areas.
- 8. Outstanding work in one or more special projects in any academic field of study.
- Recent, marked improvement in academic performance as demonstrated by academic GPA and the quality of coursework completed or in progress.
- 10. Special talents, achievements and awards in a particular field, such as visual and performing arts, communication or athletic endeavors; special skills, such as demonstrated written and oral proficiency in other languages; special interests, such as intensive study and exploration of other cultures; experiences that demonstrate unusual promise for leadership, such as significant community service or significant participation in student government; or other significant experiences or achievements that demonstrate the student's promise for contributing to the intellectual vitality of a campus.
- 11. Completion of special projects undertaken in the context of your high school curriculum or in conjunction with special school events, projects or programs.
- 12. Academic accomplishments in light of your life experiences and special circumstances, including but not limited to: disabilities, low family income, first generation to attend college, need to work, disadvantaged social or educational environment, difficult personal and family situations or circumstances, refugee status or veteran status.
- 13. Location of your secondary school and residence.

# UC Application

- One online application for up to 9 campuses
- Last year: \$70 per campus (fee waivers available)
- Apply Nov. 1 30th (Opens in August)
- Plan to enter:
  - All A-G courses & grades taken 9th 11th
  - 12th grade courses (In Progress/Planned)
  - Extracurricular, community service, work experience, etc.
  - Personal Insight Questions (essays)
- UC's do not want transcripts (until July).
- UC will not accept recommendation letters.
- Look for UC Tips sheet in the Fall from Ms Rasor.

# Cal State University (CSU)

- Career focused. Most are semester system.
- Selection depends on campus/major impaction.
- Impacted = not enough space for all eligible applicants in all majors (including undeclared)

Impacted campuses over the past 2 yrs: Cal Poly SLO, Fresno, Fullerton, Long Beach, San Diego, San Jose, & Cal State LA

 Non-impacted = space for all who meet A-G eligible applicants (Some majors may be impacted).

# CSU Application & Admission

- One application for up to 24 campuses
  Apply online Oct Nov
  Last year: \$70 per campus (fee waivers available)
- Plan to enter all A-G courses & grades taken 9th -11th and in progress/planned during 12th.
- Admission into impacted campuses/majors:
  - types of courses taken in high school & gpa
  - preparedness for intended major
  - SAT/ACT scores will not be considered
- Do not send transcripts with application.
- CSU do not accept teacher recommendations.
- Look for CSU Tip Sheet from Ms Rasor in the fall

### **Out-of-State Public Universities**

- Tuition is higher but most are more affordable compared to UC/CSU and most are not impacted.
  - Check for in-state tuition breaks: <u>WUE</u>
- Curriculum varies: liberal arts education and/or career-focused
- Check campus websites for:
  - Admission requirements & deadlines (may differ from A-G)
  - How to apply: campus portal (application), Common App or Coalition App
  - Most do NOT require SAT/ACT (best to check)

# **Private Colleges**

- Thousands of private colleges across US (85 in CA)
- Explore what they offer. For example:
  - academic & personal development approach
  - liberal arts or career-ready education
  - smaller class sizes; conservatories
  - guarantee completion in four years
  - Alumni Networks
  - 3-2 programs (transfer programs)
  - Religiously centered (or affiliated)
  - Culturally (HBCU) or gender focused
- Tuition is much higher compared to a UC/CSU

# Admission to Private College

Admission factors most likely include:

- College fit.
- Profile (compared to previously admitted class)
- Academic & Personal Achievements
- Legacy & school ranking (Carlmont does not rank)
- Special majors may require audition/portfolio

Drawn from all sections of the Common App, including:

- Personal Statement (essay),
- Possibly supplemental essay(s),
- Transcripts (initial & mid-year),
- Teacher & Counselor Recommendation Letters

# How to apply to Private Colleges

The Common App (opens in July)

• Fees (to apply) vary by school (fee waivers available)

Deadline to apply varies. Each school lists options:

- Early Action/Early Decision
- Rolling or Priority
- Regular Decision

Common App also requires:

- 1 or 2 Teacher Recommendation Letters & forms
- Counselor Recommendation Letter & forms
- Teachers/Counselors use Naviance to send materials


### Private Colleges (not on the Common App)

For private colleges not using the Common App, check school websites for application details.

- Do they use their own (portal) application or The Coalition Application?
- If they accept counselor/teachers recommendation letters, check to see what process they use in in order for us to send materials.

### How Seniors use Naviance for college planning:


- Search for colleges (SuperMatch)
- List "colleges I am applying to"
  - Add all colleges you are applying to on Naviance.
- Complete steps for a Recommendation Letter
- Check status of materials submitted to colleges
- View Scholarship List
- Register for College Rep Visits (possibly virtual)

### Steps for Recommendation Letters


Required if applying to schools via Common App, Coalition, or others requiring recommendation letters.

- Ask teachers (in person or direct email) for a recommendation letter
- Contact your counselor (early fall) for a recommendation letter and to schedule an appointment (interview)
- Create your resume in Naviance.
- Complete Naviance Letter of Recommendation (Common App)
  Questionnaire (during summer or before counseling appointment)
- Match Common App with your Naviance Account
- Add teachers as recommenders on Naviance (Fall)

It is okay to estimate average hours to include practices, weekends tournaments, etc.

#### Description/Comments Tip:

Explain why you joined, then share your goal and your role.

"I find hikes mentally rejuvenating. This is why I decided to create a Hiking Club. As president of the club, my goal is to...."

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### Matching Naviance & Common App

Required in order for us to send recommendation letters and transcripts to your Common App schools.

Log into Common App to sign FERPA Waiver:

- 1. Complete the Education section on Common App
- 2. Add schools, then Click on "My Colleges" tab
- 3. Click Recommender & FERPA tab for any school on your list
- 4. Follow instructions; say \*YES to WAIVE your rights


# You only need to do this once (FERPA Waiver populates to all schools on your Common App).

\*Lets colleges know you do not intend to read letters and reassures they are candid and true.

\*Teachers/counselors may decline to write letters if you do not waive your rights to read the letter.

### Final step to Match Accounts

- Go to "Colleges I'm applying to" on Naviance
- Click on Match Accounts (follow instructions)



### UC PIQ

UC's Personal Insight Questions (PIQ)

- Select 4 (out of 8) prompts to answer.
- Each response is limited to 350 words.
- Select prompts that best reflects your academic and life experiences. All are given equal consideration.
- Don't worry about the word count when you are drafting your responses.
- The PIQ link has great tips to make the essay introspective. It requires you to think critically and analytically.

Common App essay prompts for 2021-2022.

- Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent that is so meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please share your story.
- 2. The lessons we take from obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a challenge, setback, or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?
- Reflect on a time when you questioned or challenged a belief or idea.
  What prompted your thinking? What was the outcome?
- 4. Reflect on something that someone has done for you that has made you happy or thankful in a surprising way. How has this gratitude affected or motivated you?
- Discuss an accomplishment, event, or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others.
- 6. Describe a topic, idea, or concept you find so engaging that it makes you lose all track of time. Why does it captivate you? What or who do you turn to when you want to learn more?
- 7. Share an essay on any topic of your choice. It can be one you've already written, one that responds to a different prompt, or one of your own design.
