# My Colleges Tab - Questions section


### General


Schools that use demonstrated interest will ask if you have made contact with an admissions representative. If you have attended a college visit at Carlmont (or virtual through Carlmont) that is considered a contact. Mrs. Rasor will have the name of the admissions representative if needed.

### Recommenders and FERPA

-Sign the FERPA - this allows Carlmont to send your transcripts and letters. We suggest "Waiving" your rights on the FERP. Waiving your rights informs colleges that you will not read your teacher letters and counselor letters. **Very important** step.






- Check "I Acknowledge"
- Check "I waive my right"

Then sign, date, save and close.

**-DO NOT** request Carlmont teachers or counselors as recommenders on the Common App. Carlmont teachers can only be requested through Naviance.




### **Naviance**

Once you have completed your Personal Information on the Profile Page and Current High School information on the Education Section and add at least one college on the Common App, you can now Match your Common App to Naviance. This step will upload your college list from Common App to Naviance and enable teachers and counselors to send your letters. You should verify the application deadlines are correct in Naviance after the Matching. Teachers and Counselors will use the deadline to schedule the sending of your letters. More information on "officially" requesting teacher letters in Naviance will be sent soon.



Some Colleges will require applicants to complete questions and possibly supplemental essays specific to their college. Those questions and essay prompts will in the My Colleges tab under College Information Example:




# **Common App Tab - Education Section**

# **Colleges/Universities**

If you took a community college course during your high school career, indicate it here. All courses taken at a Community College (except PE) must be indicated on your application. This section would include courses that have produced a transcript from an online college or 4 year college.

### Example below of summer school at Community College



- If you took our Dual Enrollment courses at Carlmont such as: Biotechnology I-II, Biotechnology III - IV, Biomanufacturing Field Work and/or AP Calculus - BC(only school year 2019-2020), list it in the College/University section indicated as Dual enrollment. The Common App will not allow the community college courses to be entered. You will only enter the community college name and the date attended. You can indicate the course and grade in the additional comments area of the Writing Section.

# **Current or Most Recent Year Courses Section**

This section is referring to your senior year courses:

- Course schedule should be first semester and second semester for all courses with the exception of American Government and Economics. Those courses are either first or second semester according to your schedule.
- If you have taken Advanced Dance or Intermediate Dance the only choice is semester (Use the Additional Comments area in Writing Section)
- The indication on your transcript



# **Testing**

If you took SAT

- If college is test optional you can choose not to indicate a test date and score
- NOTE: if you indicate a test date and score you will have to send the results from College Board directly to the college.

If you took the ACT Plus Writing

**Highest Writing Score** 

- If taken prior to 2016 your score is between 1 36
- If taken after 2016 your score is between 2 12

### **Activities Section**

- List activities in order of importance to you
- This section is for more than volunteering, sports, clubs it includes employment, family obligations and other meaningful activities. For example if you attend a one time seminar that interests you, add it to your application.
- If you participated in an activity but it ended because of Covid, add that to your application.
- Do not use acronyms in the organization name unless it is very common for example YMCA
- In the "Describe this activity" they want to know your involvement more than what the activity is. For example, you do not have to describe Football, but you can describe your participation - Daily practice starting at 6am, and such. Talk more about you than the activity.

# **Writing Section**

Additional Information - This is NOT another space to write a Personal Statement. The following are suggestions to include if applicable. These are just suggestions. If there is something else you would like the college to know that is not mentioned in another part of the application, this is your opportunity.

 Use the following if you were in the BTI program - I participated in the Biotechnology Institute (BTI) in 10-12th grade. BTI is a small learning community focused on science and technology. Core BTI classes include science-themed English and social studies, as well as yearly lab science courses, including a dual enrollment Biomanufacturing course with Skyline College in 12th grade. Because of my enthusiasm for science, I chose to participate in this college-prep cross-curricular program, even though it precluded my ability to take Advanced Standing (AS) and AP courses in English and history.

- Indicate any reason why your grades dropped, do not repeat yourself if you addressed this in your Personal Statement (e.g. family struggles, concussion, Covid, health issues etc)
- State the reason if there was a course you could not take at CHS (example class was full etc)
- Indicate if you are/were enrolled in Intermediate or Advanced Dance, that is a quarter class
- Life Skills is a quarter class (optional statement only if you add that course to your application)
- AP B/C Calc earns college credit as Math 251/Math 252 only if you took it during 2019-2020 school year.
- If you took Algebra in middle school and/or Geometry and/or a foreign language (can not be listed anywhere else)
- World Studies 1 is a quarter class.





### **Courses & Grades**

Not all colleges will require this section. This section is for entering your high school grades 9th - 11th. If your Common App deadline is after senior first semester grades are posted in January, you would include those grades here. If your deadline is January 15 or before, you will indicate that you Do Not have 12th grade courses on your transcript

**Example (of no senior grades)** 



We are a semester school

Our grading scale is A-F

Almost all of our courses are College Prep or Honor/AP.

The indication if it is College Prep or Regular or AP/Honors is on your transcript

P = College Prep

HP = honors/AP

No indications means it is a regular class (example Life Skills)

For World Studies 1 indicate the credit was 2.5 (that will tell them it was a quarter class) For World Studies 2 indicate semester 5.0 credits.

Listing Life Skills is optional to list because it is not a college prep class. If you choose to enter it indicate the credit was 2.5
