Before you start your application



Have available

- Your Carlmont transcript
- Your Community Colleges transcript if applicable
- List of activities, sports, employment, clubs, volunteering
- Personal information such as social security number and family income
- ACT/SAT score if taken, this entry is optional
- AP Scores if taken and list of AP exam to be taken May 2021



- Save your user name and password for the application.
- You can use any email you wish for the application.
- Keep your Application ID number after submission
- You should click "Save & continue" at the bottom of each page to save any entered information (there is a 20-minute inactivity period after which the application will automatically sign you out).
- Applications can be submitted starting Nov 1, submitting your application on Nov 1 will
 NOT get your application reviewed first. Please take your time with your application.
- Submission deadline is Nov 30, do not wait until the last minute to submit application
- Application decisions will be sent in March.
- After you submit you will be unable to make corrections.

Section: Campuses Majors

Page: Choose Majors

Prior to applying, research majors offered at the campus of choice. https://admission.universityofcalifornia.edu/campuses-majors/majors/

If you are unsure what you want to major in yet, you can choose "Undecided" or "Undeclared" if it is allowed on your campus.

An alternate major is your second-choice major. Although choosing an alternative major is optional, it's a good idea to select one if it's available at the campus you're applying to. If a campus is unable to offer you a place in your primary major, they may consider you for your alternate major. Some campuses do not allow an alternate major choice.

A capped/impacted major is a major that historically has more applicants than the campus can accept.. If you choose a capped/impacted major on your admissions application, we highly recommend that you also select an alternate major that is uncapped/impacted.

Page: 7th and 8th grade



Math and Language Other than English can be entered.

If you took Geometry or above in 9th grade at Carlmont you can enter your 7th and/or 8th grade Algebra course.

If you started 9th grade at Carlmont in a World Language level II or above, you can enter the world language course taken in 7th or 8th grade.

No need to enter the grade as it is not calculated into the GPA. Enter Pass if you received a C or above.



Test Scores

Statement from UC

UC will not consider SAT or ACT test scores when making admissions decisions or awarding scholarships.

If you've taken these exams & choose to report your scores, your scores may be used for course placement after you enroll.

If you took an SAT/ACT it is your choice if you want to indicate it on your application. UC has stated they would like students to indicate AP scores even if they are low.









Section: Activities & Awards

An Activity is something you do with your spare time.

- The activity does not have to be an organized activity.
- Caretaking for a grandparent, babysitting for a sibling those are activities.
- List all your activities but focus on the ones that are most important to you first
- The description should be more about you than the organization.
- Bullet points are encouraged.
- Leadership in an activity does not have to be official.
- Only report an activity in one area even if it can be applicable in multiple areas
- Other courses taken
- Write your rough draft of the section in a google doc, application times out.

Awards

 Awards can be at the school level, city level, state level, national level or international level. Parents/Guardians are resources for remembering awards you may have received.

You can enter your activities and awards one at a time. First, select a category from the dropdown menu below. Once you've selected a category, you'll be able to tell us more about the activity or award in the follow-up questions.

Description of categories

Award or honor: We want to know about the awards and honors you've received that mean the most to you.

Educational preparation programs: Any programs or activities that have enriched your academic experiences or helped you prepare for college.

Extracurricular activity: These could include hobbies, clubs, sports or anything else you haven't had the chance to tell us about.

Other coursework: These are courses other than those required for UC admission (courses that do not fit in UC's A-G subject areas).

Volunteering / Community service: These are activities you've donated time and effort to without getting paid.

Work experience: This is for telling us about any paid jobs or paid internships you've had.

Scholarship & Programs Section

You can apply to a number of UC scholarships (that means free money) right here in the application. The scholarships listed below are awarded to students with specific backgrounds, academic interests or career objectives. If you don't see any categories that are relevant to you, don't worry. In addition to these scholarships, each campus and many alumni associations award a variety of scholarships that recognize students' achievement and potential. You'll also need to file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California DreamAct



Section: Personal Insight Page: Personal Insight Questions

- This application times out within 20 minutes.
- We suggest not to work on the PIQ in the application.
- Copy and paste the questions into a word or google doc..
- When completed, then paste it back into your application.
- Only write about COVID if your circumstance was unique.

All PIQs should be review by either your counselor, your english teacher, or a trained reader.

Section: Personal Insight Page: Additional Comments

How is this Additional comments area in this section different from the Additional comments area in "Academic history"?

This comments area can be used to explain anything that may be unclear in other parts of your application. The Additional comments area in the "Academic history" section can be used to explain circumstances that affected your academic record. The purpose of the Additional comments areas is not to answer an additional personal insight question.

Remember Do Not Repeat Yourself!

> Not a space for an additional PIC

Possible uses of this section:

- Parents/Guardians lost their job due to COVID
- Change in extracurriculars due to COVID (loss of opportunity or newly found one)
- How COVID or social justice movement impacted decision to apply to UC and/or your intended major
- Elaborate on something in your application
- Unusual personal circumstance
- Last chance to tell the UC something about yourself that is NOT in any other part of your application-if you don't tell them, they will not know!
